# HOSPITALIZATIONS IN BRITISH TROOPS DURING OPERATION JOINT ENDEAVOUR (BOSNIA)

## Aim

To analyse admissions of British troops to British hospital facilities in Bosnia during 1996.

### Methods

Defence Analytical Services Agency (DASA) dataset retrieved on UK hospitalizations in Bosnia. Population data HQ MND (SW), Split.

#### Results

414 admissions, of which 51 % were due to disease, 49 % to injury. Common medical problems were musculoskeletal disorders, dermatology, g-l

tract disorders. Uncommon medical problems were acute infections. Commonest surgical problem was injury to lower limb. Uncommon surgical problems were dental emergencies.

## **Conclusions**

Need for endoscopy in the field. Sterile, temperature-controlled operating environment with good radiological support, and coding of operations/procedures. Integrated clinical information system, with complete capture of hospital data.
